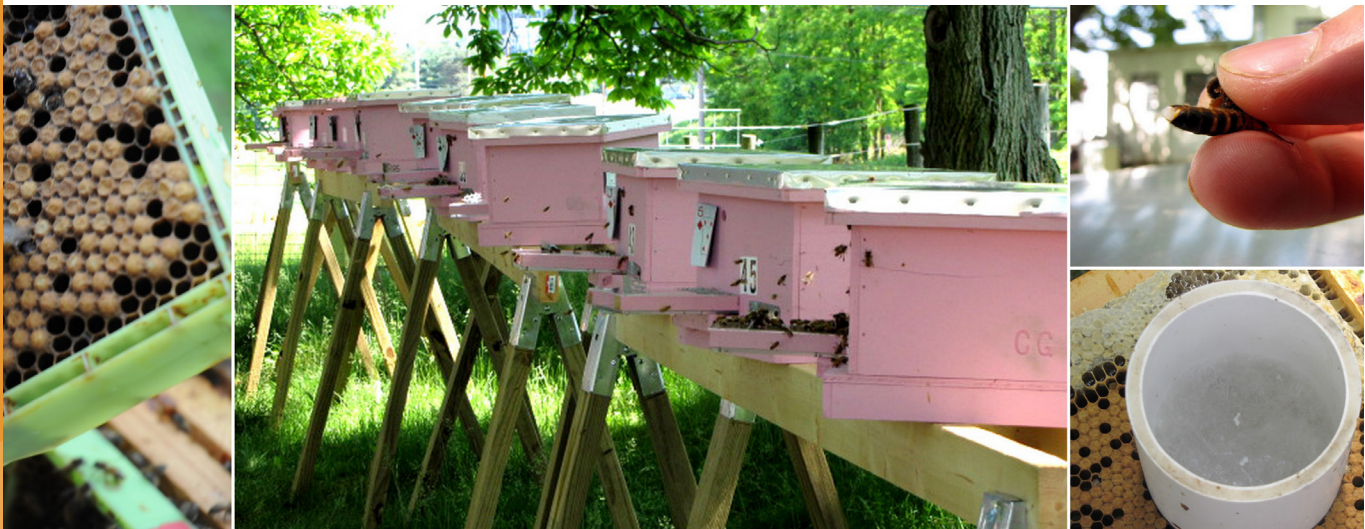


Honey Bee Breeding Basics
